Why Would a Municipality Lease?

State government, at all levels, face unprecedented demands for equipment at a time when revenue shortfalls and budget cuts are the norm, rather than the exception.

No Obligation

Leases represent a year-to-year commitment on the part of a municipality to make lease payments. If for some reason the funds aren't approved for a new budget cycle, you have no obligation.

A Challenge to Municipal Customers -- Managing Equipment Fleets:

- Aging Equipment Fleets In fleets today, the average age of battery operated equipment is six years or older. There are some exceptions -- one municipal customer had equipment that was over 20 years old!
- Increased Labor Costs As equipment ages, the time spent using slower, less efficient equipment increases, thereby increasing labor costs.
- High Repair Costs At four years old, annual maintenance and repair costs can range from \$1,500 to \$2,500 per machine. Oftentimes, these charges are not noticed, as they can be put in a variety of accounting categories. At the end of the year, administration doesn't have a clear understanding of how much money they are spending.

A Solution:

- Offering a municipal lease. Customers get the right new equipment they need now, and spread the cost over three budget periods.
- The right new equipment will run more smoothly, clean more effectively, and reduce cleaning times. The right new equipment reduces labor costs.
- The right new equipment costs less to operate, because it's new and comes with a three year warranty. The right new equipment reduces repair costs.
